

Giving From the Heart

Debi Coleman had long associated herself with innovation.

In 1981, Apple co-founder Steve Jobs hired Debi Coleman as project controller of the Macintosh team. From there, she held multiple roles at Apple, including vice president for operations, chief financial officer, and vice president for information systems and technology. She left Apple in 1992 to join Tektronix, and in 2000 formed the venture capital firm SmartForest Ventures LLC, specializing in early investments in tech companies throughout the Portland, Oregon area.

Coleman passed away on October 15, 2021, but her memory lives on through an incredible legacy of support. Coleman brought her own generosity to Oregon Health & Science University's Knight Cardiovascular Institute. In addition to donating over \$1 million to various areas of OHSU and OHSU Doernbecher Children's Hospital throughout her lifetime, she joined other donors in support of the Melvin Judkins Professorship by establishing a major gift in her estate plan to fully endow the position.

An endowed position — especially when named in honor of a distinguished individual — is OHSU's most powerful means of honoring highly accomplished faculty. It provides a faculty leader with substantial annual

This award is named for Melvin Judkins, M.D., a radiologist recognized internationally as an authority on radiologic equipment and on the diagnosis of coronary artery disease.

The impact of this generous gift is explained by Joaquin E. Cigarroa, M.D, the division head of cardiology and professor of medicine at the OHSU Knight Cardiovascular Institute. "We are incredibly appreciative of Debi's generosity," said Dr. Cigarroa. "This gift will grant us access to resources that allow us to support areas of research in interventional cardiology, ischemic heart disease and heart attacks. It will also help us mentor the next generation of providers and invest in our current faculty."

Interventional cardiology uses catheter-based techniques to diagnose and treat cardiovascular disease. During interventional cardiology procedures, specially trained experts use catheters to determine how blood is flowing through the heart and correct defects.

Cigarroa recalled Coleman as an amazing person and remarkable trailblazer in her career. And yet when you talked to her, she led with humanity, humility and curiosity, he said. Gifts such as Coleman's make a fundamental difference in OHSU's capabilities.

Give a Gift That Pays You Back

A charitable gift annuity is a gift that creates dependable income. You donate assets that OHSU Foundation invests. In return, we make fixed payments to you for life (and, if desired, for another beneficiary's lifetime). At the end of the agreement, the balance remaining goes toward the life-saving programs OHSU and Doernbecher are known for.

Your Benefits

- + Receive lifetime payments for yourself and possibly another person.
- + Qualify for a charitable deduction for a portion of the value of the gift.
- + Secure partially income tax–free payments throughout your life expectancy.
- + Save on capital gains taxes when you contribute appreciated securities.

See Your Impact — And Save on Taxes

If you're 70½ or older, use the IRA charitable rollover (sometimes referred to as a qualified charitable distribution) to make a tax-free gift to OHSU Foundation and/or Doernbecher Children's Hospital. You can transfer any amount up to \$100,000. Beginning the year you turn 72, you can use your gift to satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.

Your Benefits

- + Your gift will be used today, allowing you to see your impact.
- + You pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer doesn't generate taxable income or a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize.
